



# Great Chicago Fire – Oct. 8-10, 1871

Killed 300 people, left 100,000 people homeless, and destroyed over 3 square miles of the city...

**...led to stricter fire safety laws and building codes, including banning wooden buildings within city limits.**

# San Francisco Earthquake – April 18, 1906

Killed more than 3,000 people,  
destroyed 28,000 buildings and  
displaced half the city population...

...spawned modern earthquake  
science and the development of  
safer building standards.

# Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire – March 25, 1911

The deadliest industrial disaster in **New York's history, causing the deaths of 146 garment workers...**

**...Governor Al Smith and Frances Perkins** passed the first state workplace guarantees in the country in 1911.

# The Great Mississippi Flood – 1927

The most destructive river flood  
**in the country's history, affecting  
more than 630,000 people...**


**...Congress passed the Flood Control Act of  
1928 to levee future flooding – at the time,  
the largest public works appropriation ever.**



# The Great Depression – 1929-1939

The longest, deepest, and most widespread economic depression **of the 20th century...**

**...reversed through President Franklin Delano Roosevelt's New Deal legislation, leading to the dawn of the "American Century".**



# 9/11 – September 11th, 2001

2,977 innocent Americans lost their lives in the deadliest terrorist attack **on American soil...**

**...the Department of Homeland Security** was established, representing the largest restructuring of the U.S. government in contemporary history.

# Superstorm Sandy – Oct. 22nd – Nov. 2nd, 2012

Killed at least 53 people  
and caused \$32.8 billion  
in damages in New York
